Building a Bridge Between Veterinarians and Groomers

The Bridge Club Hosts Critical Conversation to Further Elevate Pet Care

PALATINE, Ill. — March 13, 2023 — Today, veterinarians see the average client approximately two times per year, while 81 percent of all dog owners and 13 percent of all cat owners have seen a groomer in the past 12 months and average four to six visits a year. If groomers see veterinary clients more often than a veterinarian, is there an opportunity for these two professions to unite to further elevate a pet's care? The Bridge Club is diving into how veterinarians and groomers can do more than coexist on **April 19 at 5 p.m. PST/7 p.m. CST/8 p.m. EST.**

To facilitate the live, virtual conversation, The Bridge Club will be joined by Dr. Marty Greer, industry leader and owner of three veterinary practices in Wisconsin; Andrea Rich, an award-winning groomer and breeder from Greendale, Wis.; and Erin Meyer, AKC Grooming Programs Administrator & Project Analyst.

The conversation will dive into the causes of the rift between the two professions, including veterinary concerns over the lack of licensing/certification, teeth scaling, diagnosing and prescription versus OTC products. The groomer voice will address their role in health maintenance being fundamental to the welfare of companion animals, in providing access to care across socio-economic levels and advocating for pets by driving action by pet parents.

The key to creating a relationship begins with a conversation. Dr. Greer said, "While some practitioners may not be ready for a partnership, I value the relationships I have with all the groomers in my area. They have saved the lives of many pets by seeing something and immediately directing the pet parent to get an appointment with my team."

"Groomers are a unique bunch and like many professions, it is important to know who you are working with. But the majority of us commit ourselves to ongoing education, recognize our role and work hard to build trust with our pet parents. We would love to do the same with the veterinarians who care for the same pets," says Rich.
